What Is Lone Working?

Solo Operations

Working without direct interaction with colleagues

Remote Locations

Away from primary workplace or at home

Sole Charge

Significant time spent working independently



Key Responsibilities

1

Management

Identify risks, implement controls, provide training and equipment

2

Workers

Follow procedures, report incidents, use protective equipment properly

3

Organisation

Allocate resources, ensure systematic risk assessment processes



Safety Systems Required



Location Tracking

Know where lone workers are at all times



Emergency Contact

Clear procedures for problems and emergencies



Risk Awareness

Comprehensive understanding of hazards and controls



Communication & Wellbeing



Regular Contact

Scheduled calls and video conversations with managers



Team Meetings

Opportunities to connect with colleagues regularly



Mental Health

Support for stress levels and wellbeing



Personal Safety Measures



Safety Equipment

Panic buttons, GPS trackers, mobile apps provided



Skills Training

Conflict resolution and self-defence techniques offered



Immediate Support

Assistance for victims of abuse or violence
